


Difficult Realities

- (1) The deep and pervasive harm of violence against women,
- (2) The deep and pervasive harm of mass incarceration and its impact on marginalized communities, and
- (3) The ways in which survivors of battering are routinely caught up in the criminal legal system.

Unintended Consequences

Reforms to institutional policy and practice that are meant to increase safety and well-being for survivors of battering, that instead jeopardize safety and well-being and contribute to disparity of impact.

Disparity of Impact

Exists when the proportion of a **specific group** within the control of the criminal legal system is **greater than its proportion in the general population** or when the criminal legal system intervention has a **more negative impact on a specific group**.




