



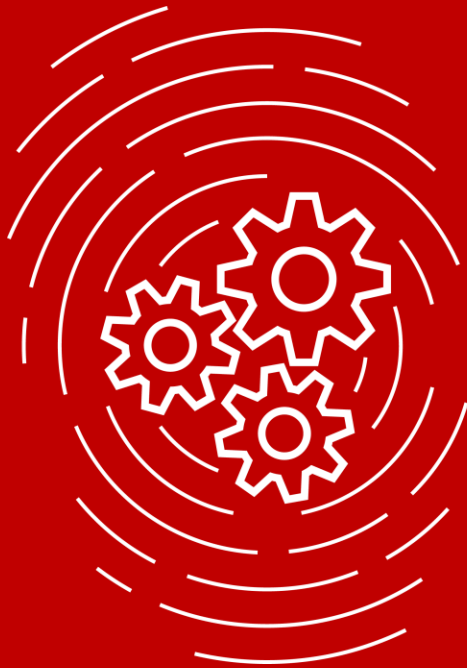

Why Sexual Assault Training?

Sexual Violence Affects Millions of Americans



- On average, there are 463,634 victims (age 12 or older) of rape and sexual assault each year in the United States.
- 1 out of every 6 American women has been the victim of an attempted or completed rape in her lifetime (14.8% completed, 2.8% attempted).
- About 3% of American men—or 1 in 33—have experienced an attempted or completed rape in their lifetime.

Sexual assault training helps law enforcement agencies effectively respond to these complex crimes.

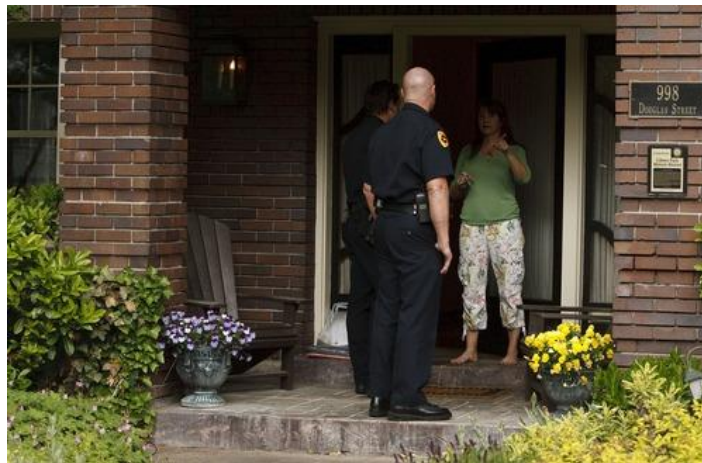


Speaking with a survivor at the hospital, they cannot remember the perpetrators face, but they can remember his shoes in detail. What does this mean for our work?
